



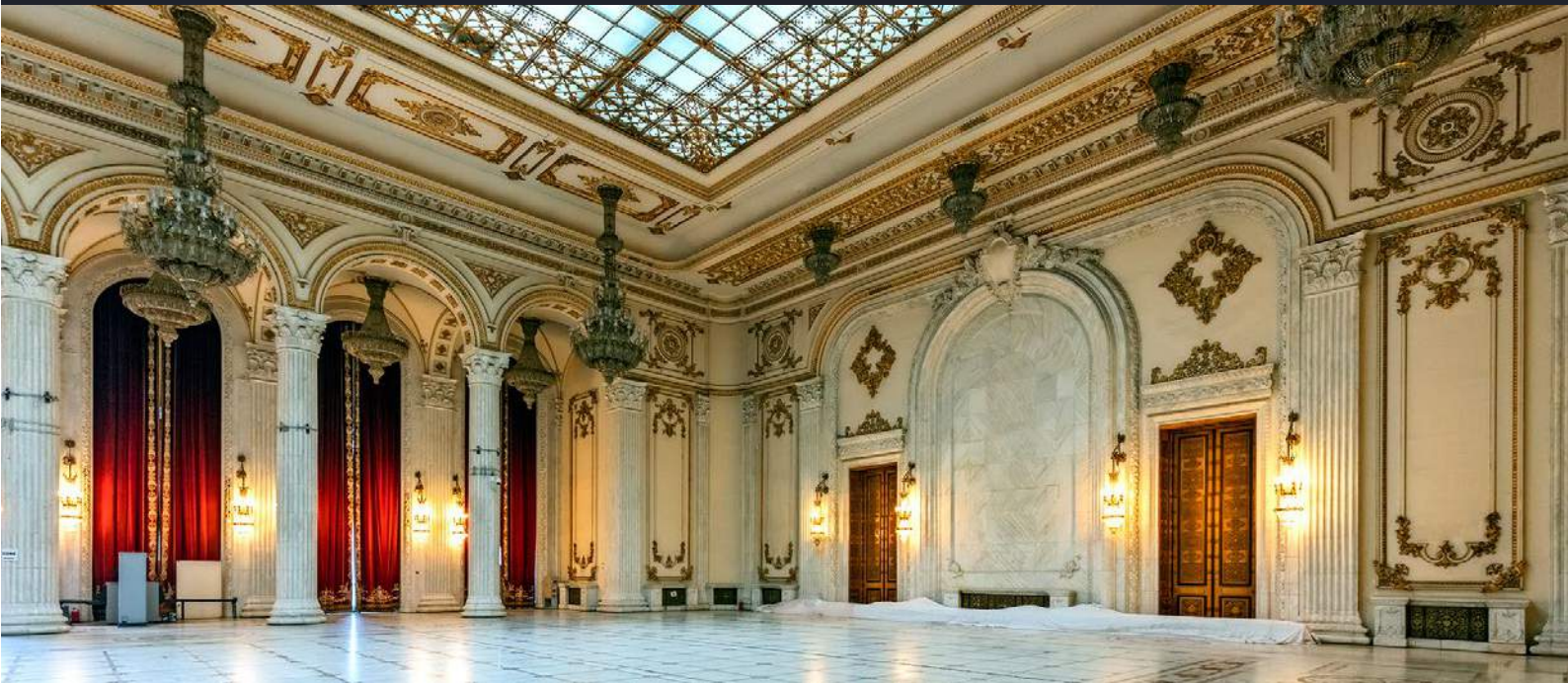

Palace of Parliament



Visiting Hours

- **March – October**, daily between 9 am and 5 pm (last tour starts at 4.30 pm)
- **November – February**, daily between 10 am and 4 pm (last tour starts at 3.30 pm)

Available Tours:

- Standard Tour (about 1h) – **40 lei/person**
- Standard Tour + basement – **45 lei/person**
- Full Tour (about 2h, including Standard Tour, City Panoramic on the Terrace + Basement) – **55 lei/person**

Useful info:

In order to access the Palace of Parliament please have a valid ID or passport with you for all visitors. Reservations are confirmed with maximum 24 hours in advance!

Visiting Hours

- **Wednesdays through Sundays** between 10 am and 6 pm (last tour starts at 5 pm)

Tickets:

- **50 lei / person** – group tour with English speaking guide – requires appointment
- **200 lei / person** – private tour of 1,5 – 2h

Useful Info:

The tour lasts 45 minutes.

Reservations are to be made for the tours at least 24h in advance.

- **Closed on Monday**
- **Tuesdays through Fridays** between 9 am and 7 pm (summer time) & 9 am to 5 pm (winter time)

Tickets:

- **15 lei / person** – adults
- **300 lei** - guided tour with a private guide (english, french, spanish, italian, russian available) – requires a 48h notice before actual tour date

The reservation for the guided tours is compulsory and it must be made at least seven days in advance.

- **April – October:** closed on Mondays, Tuesday through Sunday between 10 am and 8 pm (last tour at 7 pm)
- **November – March:** closed on Mondays, Tuesday through Friday between 10 am and 6 pm (last tour at 5 pm), Saturdays and Sundays between 10 am and 7 pm (last tour at 6 pm)

Tickets:

- **20 lei / person** – adults
- **5 lei / person** – children
- **200 lei / tour** – english guide

Unirii Square Fountains



The refurbished fountains in Unirii Square, are the city's new tourist attraction. These are the first fountains in Europe to enjoy of state-of-the-art equipment and offer a new perspective on water and the city alike.

The fountains, probably the biggest ensemble in southeastern Europe, will offer multimedia shows every Friday, Saturday and Sunday, in between 20:00 and 21:00, for as long as the weather allows it.

Therme Bucharest

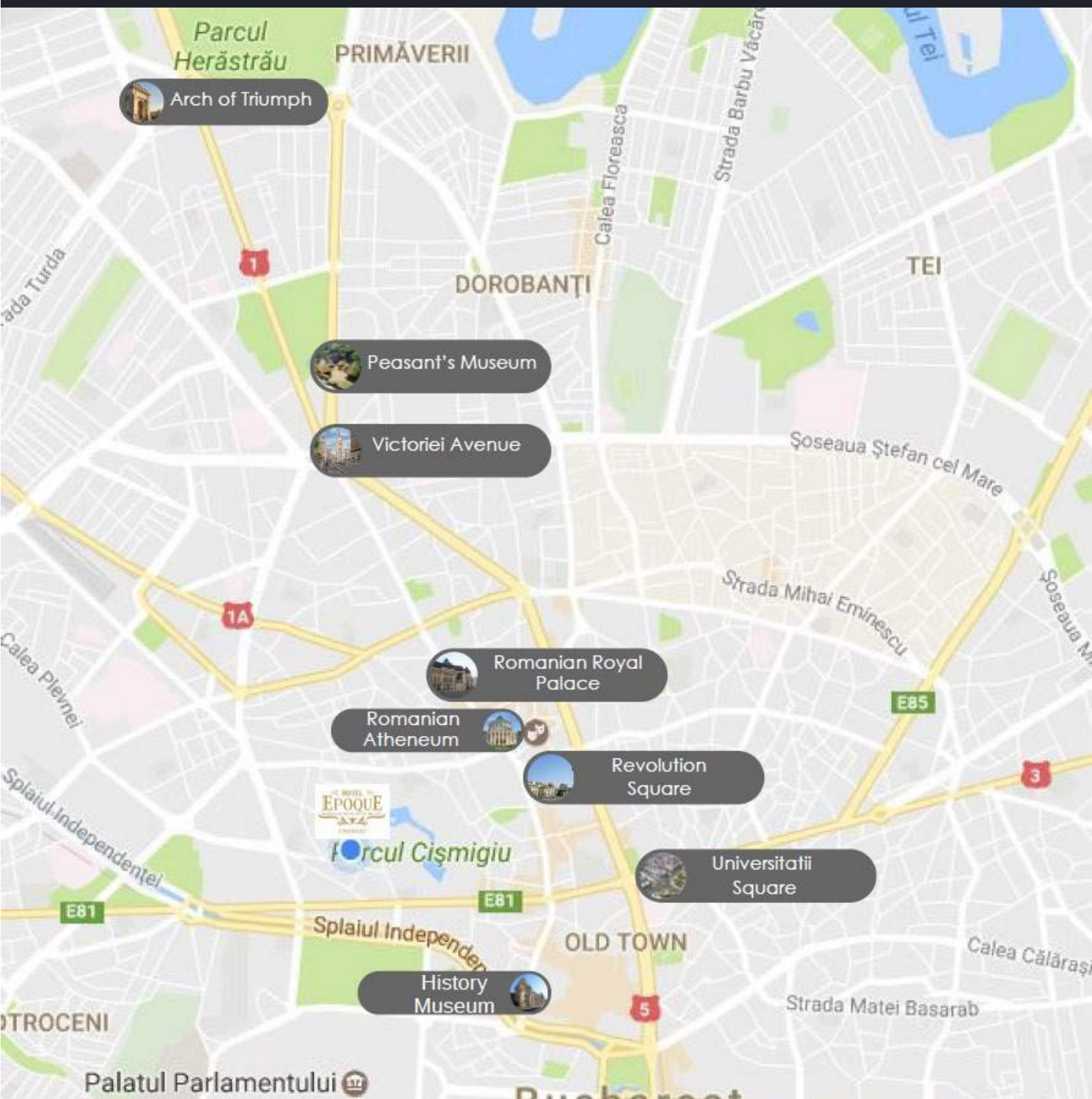

At Therme Bucharest, nature meets man in the most beautiful setup, which hosts the largest botanical garden in Romania with over 800,000 plants, including 1,500 palm trees, orchids and many other unique species.
